Divine Mercy Sunday...One Sunday in 1931, St. Faustina had a mystic experience of Jesus, clothed in a white garment with his right hand raised in blessing. His left hand was touching his garment near his heart, from where two large rays came forth, one red and the other pale, symbolizing Blood and the baptismal water. In 1934 with the help of Fr. Michael Sopocho, the painter Eugene Kazimierowski created the original Divine Mercy painting under St. Faustina's direction. The painting, having miraculously survived World War II and the Soviet Occupation thereafter, eventually was restored and hung in a church in Lithuania in 2005. The Church is now known as the Church of the Divine Mercy. The image represents the graces of Divine Mercy poured out upon the world, especially through Baptism and the Eucharist. *Jesus, I trust in you!*
