### **Weekly Notes from "Mass Journal" by Matthew Kelly-**

*God Show me one way in this Mass I can become a better version of myself this week!*

The saints were remarkable men and women, but surprisingly what made them remarkable was rarely anything too spectacular. What made them extraordinary was the ordinary. They strove to grow in virtue through the ordinary things of everyday life. If they were caring for the sick they were growing in humility. When they were educating children they were growing in patience.

As Saint Therese of Lisieux said, "Do the little things with great love." There is nothing more attractive than holiness. Throughout history, wherever men and women of holiness have lived, the Church has blossomed. This is the answer to all of our questions and the solution to all of our problems: holiness of life. What are you willing to live for? Just before her death, Joan of Arc wrote, "I know this now. Every man gives his life for what he believes. Every woman gives her life for what she believes. Sometimes people believe in little or nothing, and yet they give their lives to that little or nothing. One life is all we have, and we live it as we believe in living it and then it's gone. But to surrender what you are and to live without belief is more terrible than dying—even more terrible than dying young." What are you willing to give your life for?
