Marriage Minute...A Little Goes a Long Way! In this weekend's first reading, a destitute widow provides a cup of water and a small loaf of bread for the prophet Elijah, and her generosity is rewarded with a miracle. Her meager offering sustains them until the famine ends. Like the widow, when we offer our spouse a small kindness from our limited stock, miracles often occur. Dr. Greg Popcak stresses "caretaking in conflict" as one of the hallmarks of a successful marriage. Next time you are arguing with your spouse: • Hold hands • Offer to bring him/her a drink or snack • Avoid placing blame • Use polite language These difficult things pay off, and the miracle is that your spouse begins to believe that your relationship is more important than any issue that comes between you!
